Calls and Commitments Needed for SB 2170

On Tuesday, March 1, the House voted to recommit House Bill 1492, its version of the Supervisors Educational Pay Supplement Certification Program. By recommitting this bill, it automatically "killed" the bill.

The Senate companion bill, SB 2170, is still alive.

We <u>URGENTLY</u> need county supervisors calling their House members to get commitments in supporting and fighting for passage of SB 2170. This bill

passed the Senate on a 48-1 vote!



REVENUE AND APPROPRIATIONS BILLS

With Thursday's deadline passing, we are now halfway through the legislative process. Next week, legislators will begin to shift their focus more towards Revenue and Appropriation bills. Now is the time to talk with your legislative delegation about the need for more infrastructure funding and the need to fully fund the homestead exemption reimbursement at \$87 million.

HOUSE & SENATE PASS BILLS TO EXTEND LIFE OF LOCAL SYSTEMS BRIDGE PROGRAM

Both House Bill 878 and Senate Bill 2469 have passed out of their original chambers. They now head to opposite chambers for consideration. Both bills bring the Local Systems Bridge Program (LSBP) code sections forward to consideration. The LSBP Program expires this June 2016. MAS has been informed by the Office of State Aid that one of the two bills will be used as a vehicle to extend the life of the LSBP Program.
