





Total Expected Jobs from Projects Won, 2018-2020





Mississippi Counties - LFPR (2019)








Starred counties (DeSoto, Hinds, Rankin, Simpson) had LFPRs in 2019 that equaled or exceeded the national average (63%).

Population Density vs Labor Force Participation Rate in Mississippi Counties






Mississippi Top Greenfield Sites >200 Acres







Mississippi's 10 Leading Industries



Mississippi's Next Tier of Leading Industries





2019 Small Municipalities and Limited Population Counties Grants, By County




