## COVID-19 EMERGENCY RELIEF PROGRAM FOR MISSISSIPPI COUNTIES & MUNICIPALITIES



### REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES THROUGH CARES ACT FUNDS:

- Expenses for quarantining individuals
- Payroll expenses for those mitigating COVID-19
- Improvements made to teleworking capabilities
- Providing paid sick/medical leave
- Sanitation and social distancing improvements for prisons and jails
- Expenditures for payroll support programs
- Unemployment insurance costs

### REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES THROUGH FEMA:

- Disinfection of public facilities
- Technical assistance to mitigate threats
- Medical facility services & supplies (eg. COVID testing)
- Establishing temporary medical facilities
- Emergency medical transport
- Non-congregate medical sheltering
- Purchase & distribution of food, medical supplies and PPE
- Communication & enforcement of health orders
- Expenses to ensure public safety

## Public Assistance – Blue Lane

State, Local, Territorial, and Tribal governments can apply for FEMA's Public Assistance program. FEMA assistance will be provided at a 75% **federal** cost share for eligible items such as -

- Disinfection of public facilities
- Purchase and Distribution of food, medical supplies PPE
- Overtime for employees working COVID19 tasks
- Emergency Medical Transport
- Non-Congregate Medical Sheltering
- Communication & Enforcement of Health Orders

## CARES Emergency Relief Program – Red Lane

### REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES THROUGH CARES ACT FUNDS:

Counties and Municipalities can apply for the CARES Emergency Relief Program. CARES assistance will be provided at 100% reimbursement for eligible items.

- Expenses for quarantining individuals
- Payroll expenses for employees mitigating COVID 19
- Unemployment insurance costs
- Expenditures for payroll support programs
- Providing paid sick/medical leave
- Improvements made to teleworking capabilities
