CALL-TO-ACTION WEIGHT LIMIT BILL NOW RESIDES ON THE HOUSE FLOOR Senate Bill 2418

On Tuesday February 27, the House Agriculture Committee passed out <u>Senate Bill 2418</u>. This bill increases the weight limit tolerance on vehicle axles from a 5% tolerance to a 10% for harvest permit vehicles and vehicles loading and unloading at state ports.

NOTE: MDOT has just informed the MAS office that if <u>Senate Bill 2418</u> becomes law, counties will have to go through another round of bridge "re-inspections" to analyze an accurate weight that will accommodate the new load weight. This could cost as much as \$28.5 million and take as long as two years.

This bill is currently on the House Floor calendar.

EDUCATION REFORM: SCHOOL FUNDING REWRITE DIES ON SENATE FLOOR

On Thursday March 1st, the Mississippi Senate debated House Bill 957 (*Mississippi Uniform Per Student Funding Formula Act of 2018*) on the Senate Floor. After a lengthy debate, they voted to recommit the bill, which ultimately killed it.

DEBT SETOFF LEGISLATION: HOUSE BILL 1029 SURIVIES DEADLINE

<u>House Bill 1029</u> authorizes county and municipal government to collect debts by a setoff against a debtor's income tax refund. This bill will be another effective tool to help collect debts owed to county government. This bill has passed the Senate Finance Committee and currently resides on the Senate Floor Calendar.

NOTE: This bill has until March 7th to pass off the Senate Floor Chamber. Please contact your local Senate delegation and request that they vote **"YEA"** on House Bill 1029.

RURAL FIRE TRUCK FUNDING SURVIVES DEADLINE Senate Bill 2467

Both original rural fire truck funding bills House Bill 948 and House Bill 49 died in the Senate on Tuesday's deadline day. Yet, the House amended <u>Senate Bill 2467</u> with the same rural fire truck funding language from the HB-948 and HB-49. <u>Senate Bill 2467</u> has passed the House Chamber and will now head to the Senate for Concurrence or Non-Concurrence.
