# **THE 2021 REGULAR LEGISLATIVE SESSION**

## (ALERT)

### HOUSE TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REMOVES LOTTERY REVENUE FROM WEIGHT LIMIT BILL (SENATE BILL 2825)

On Tuesday, March 2<sup>nd</sup>, the House Transportation Committee amended <u>Senate Bill 2825</u> from its original form. One of the amending actions taken was to remove the lottery revenue from going into the Emergency Road and Bridge Repair Fund (ERBRF). The increase in the hauling weight limit is still in the bill.

Please contact your HOUSE DELEGATION and request that they <u>OPPOSE Senate Bill</u> <u>2825</u>, because it currently does not have any money to support the proposed weight limit increase. (NOTE: This measure currently resides on the House Floor Calendar).

#### IMPORTANT LEGISLATIVE ITEMS THAT SURVIVED THIS WEEK'S DEADLINE

<u>Senate Bill 2189 & House Bill 493:</u> Allows counties & cities the discretion to offer their Medicare eligible employees the option to transition from the county health benefits over to Medicare.

Senate Bill 2062 & Senate Bill 2602: Support for the Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Program.

<u>Senate Bill 2336</u>: Delays the mandated implementation of the First Responder Health and Safety Act until year 2023. Without the delay, or state funding, counties and cities will be soon faced with an expensive unfunded mandate.

**House Bill 520:** Allows both counties and municipalities to utilize the "Use Tax" diversion that they receive to pledge to pay all or a portion of debt service on debt issued by a county or municipality for purposes of repair, maintenance, and/or reconstruction of roads, streets, and bridges.

House Bill 74: Extends the repealer for the Emergency 911 Operation Code Section. (CALLS STILL NEEDED)

#### HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION REIMBURSEMENT (SENATE BILL 2923)

This measure is currently residing in the House Appropriations Committee. Section 8 of <u>Senate Bill 2923</u> makes an appropriation of \$77,038,135.00. This line-item appropriation represents a \$1.9 million cut from last year's appropriation of \$79,013,472.00. Counties need an appropriation of \$88.7 million to be fully reimbursed. Please contact your local HOUSE delegation and ask that the homestead exemption be fully funded at \$88.7 million.
